





What employers are looking for

Below are some of the main skills, behaviours and attitudes construction employers look for. Each section also includes a video featuring employers explaining why these qualities are so important in the industry.

1. Curiosity

Curiosity is the desire to learn. To progress in the industry you will have to learn new skills and gain qualifications, so a hunger to learn is a must. You can learn everything you need to know about your occupation, even if you have no prior knowledge or experience in construction. The more curious you are, the more you'll learn. And your learning won't stop when you're qualified. Construction is changing all the time, so you'll need to keep your knowledge and skills up to date.




- vour work experience

- information about any period(s) during which you have been out of work and for how long (if applicable)
- · your motivation for applying for the job.
