Award and Extended Award for Young Leaders

Who are these qualifications for?

The ILM Level 2 Award and Extended Award for Young Leaders are ideal for individuals aged between 14 and 24 years who are actively engaged in structured learning within a group or community. The aim of both awards is to help young learners develop a range of skills and behaviours in leadership, self-management and mentoring, alongside an appreciation of the benefits that can be gained through social action (volunteering).

Benefits for individuals

- Learn essential skills in leadership and self-management
- Develop an understanding, plus core skills, in the role of mentoring
- Build evidence of your new skills through a journal of development
- Improve your personal accountability and motivation
- Get a nationally recognised qualification.

Benefits for leaders or educators of young people

- Provide a framework through which young people will develop essential lifelong personal skills and behaviours
- Provide an opportunity to gain a nationally recognised qualification that will offer a
 pathway to further educational or personal development.

Both awards feature one mandatory unit – Developing self-leadership and resilience for young people. This unit firstly builds an understanding of self-leadership, then through goal setting and planning helps the learner to develop these personal skills and finally reflect on their performance. To complete the regular award learners must complete one optional unit, to complete the extended award they must complete two optional units.

Progression

These qualifications will provide progression opportunities to other ILM qualifications, such as:

- ILM Level 2 Award in Leadership and Team Skills
- ILM Level 2 Certificate in Leadership and Team Skills
- ILM Level 3 Award in Mentoring
- ILM Level 3 Certificate in Mentoring.

Plus they will support and enhance the completion of other established recognised pathways such as:

- Community or Junior Sports Leaders Awards Level 1 or 2
- Duke of Edinburgh's Award
- GCSEs, A Levels or NVQs
- Learning Champion Training
- Qualifications for Volunteer Skills for Life Assistants
- Queen's Scout Award
- V50 or VImpact Awards.
